

What Problems Can You Face Without Car Insurance?

Fines for Driving Without Insurance in the U.S.

Each state has its own laws and penalties for driving without insurance, but in general, the consequences include:

1. Financial Penalties

- Fines range from **\$100 to \$5,000**, depending on the state.

2. Suspension of Vehicle Registration

- In some states, your **vehicle registration may be suspended** if you are caught driving without insurance.
 - **Example:** In **Florida and Georgia**, your registration will be frozen until you provide proof of insurance.

3. Driver's License Suspension
